Her experiences made her well-rounded, but it was volunteering at Dunebrook that

confirmed her path. "I learned what social workers do, and saw the change they make in the community. That's why I chose my major and have been passionate about it ever since."

SERVICE MINDED: Now a senior Human
Services major at Purdue University, Olivia
was an Indiana finalist for the prestigious Rhodes Scholarship
last year. She has used her social work, counseling, and
community engagement skills to work as an advocate in a
domestic violence shelter, a court-appointed special advocate,
a suicide hotline volunteer, and a research supervisor helping
military service members returning from deployment. She's
spending her final semester of college as an intern with the
Coalition on Homelessness in San Francisco.

**CITY EDGE:** Olivia credits the diversity in race, ethnicity, and socioeconomic background at MCHS with preparing her to work in any community. "Exposure to people both like and unlike me gave me an edge over some of my peers."
